OUR TARGETS

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Phoenix Primary School is developing a robust process of continual assessment that is based on the collaborative use of evidence related to the strategic improvement targets.

The whole of school improvement culture is based on an array of targets encompassing the learning areas of numeracy, literacy and science in relation to achievement, progress and engagement.

Phoenix Primary School is proud to be an Independent Public School which is valued as an integral part of the local community and respected for its friendly, supportive learning environment. We take pride in our rich history and achievements. Phoenix Primary has provided a quality education to multiple generations of families, who have positive memories of being educated at this school. We celebrate our cultural diversity and welcome international students as we actively encourage the sharing of cultures in our teaching and learning programs and school community events.

Phoenix provides quality education for students in years Kindergarten to Year 6. Parents and teachers work as partners in ensuring the whole school community encourages our students to participate, achieve their best and value their learning. We give them educational opportunities for their growth thus enabling them to make informed decisions about their future. Staff and students work together cooperatively to create a positive school environment in which every student feels safe and is able to learn in a friendly and caring atmosphere. We strive to create a positive, happy and rewarding school experience in which every student is a successful student and every teacher is a highly effective teacher.

Evidence based programs are put in place to support both students at educational risk (SAER) as well as our gifted and talented students. The teaching of literacy and numeracy skills is given a high priority with students being provided every opportunity to achieve to their potential. Science is also a priority area with the key skills of STEM (problem solving, analytical thinking, ability to work independently, creativity, curiosity and flexibility) being a focus.

A broad and balanced curriculum is provided for the students with physical education, digital technologies, Italian and the arts (music) having specialist teaching. Instrumental music lessons at Fremantle College are provided as an opportunity for our Year 5 and 6 students to study their chosen instrument.

There is a focus on early intervention and evidence based teaching programs which ensure our early childhood students are given a firm foundation upon which to base their learning in future years. Whole school programs ensure students build on their skills in each learning area. The use of information communication technology (ICT) to enhance student achievement is embraced by staff, as is the importance of critical and creative thinking.

Phoenix Primary School attained Independent Public School status in 2015. The school's learning and teaching culture of 'Excellence' and its strong sense of community drive the school vision. This culture of high standards has been established over time, with a commitment to encouraging personal best and an attitude of perseverance for all children in a safe and supportive learning environment. Our constant challenge is to target key areas for improvement to further develop our students as successful, motivated learners who strive to achieve standards of personal excellence in a positive learning environment. We are confident that our focus on the development of each individual child and their learning can be achieved, in partnership with our multicultural community and through strong parent-community links. Together as the Phoenix Community, we are building the learning foundations and futures of our children.

The business plan references and implements the Department of Education Corporate Framework including the Strategic Plan for WA Schools and the Director General's Classroom First Strategy and Focus documents. The Business Plan has been informed by school performance data; student, staff and community feedback through the National Survey 2016 and the recommendations of the Independent School review 2017. For this plan (2018-2020) there is explicit alignment to the five domains for improvement in the Leading for Learning Framework by Dempster (2009) as recommended by the IPS review team. The target setting utilised system data to make judgements about our improvement journey.
